- In 2009 the workplace injury rate was significantly lower when compared to the industry average with a Performance Index of 0.23<sup>1</sup> compared to an industry average of 1.0;
- An average duration of absence for short-term disability was 30 days compared to 36 days in 2008 (a reduction of 16.67%);
- The percentage of Sanofi Pasteur employees submitting long-term disability claims over the last three years is nearly 0%;
- In addition, the average duration of recovery was 4.7 months at Sanofi Pasteur less than half of what it is for the pharmaceutical industry.
